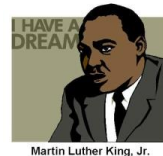

Jubilee Time Capsule Project – One of the events planned for the Jubilee Year of the Diocese is creation of a time capsule which will be housed at the Cathedral museum in Green Bay and opened 50 years from now. Our parish is invited to contribute something to that time capsule – something that symbolizes the living faith and gift that our parish community has been to northeast Wisconsin. The items must fit in a 9 x 12 envelope. Some examples of what we could submit would be an art project, newspaper clippings, a photo directory, a program from a significant parish event, photos or maps, original deeds, etc. Items shall be small, not perishable or fragile, and easily stored. Perhaps you have an old photo or program from a parish activity that you would like to submit. The items need to be submitted to the diocese before the Christ Mass on March 27.
