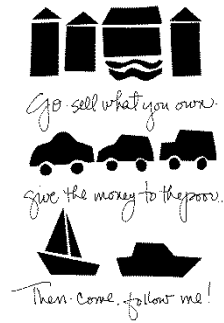

Fair Trade – Coffee, chocolate, soup mix, and tea will be sold next weekend, Oct. 20-21. The coffee we sell is from Earth Friendly and comes from a cooperative in Guatemala. Earth Friendly’s owner and the Rotary Club in Homer, Alaska, have been working to help the co-op receive more revenue for their hard work. They have made it possible for them to have a drying field to dry their coffee and they are now able to roast their own coffee. Their latest project is for our orders to go directly to them in Guatemala and they will then ship directly to us. The co-op managers say this will give the co-op and its members 25 to 50 percent more income. Thanks to the owner and the Rotary Club, more of the members make a living wage and will stay in Guatemala.
