Sign-up sheets are in the gathering space for anyone wanting to volunteer their help. Tickets for the quilts and the raffle will also be available after masses.



<u>Fair Trade</u> – Coffee, chocolate, soup mix, and tea will be sold this weekend. The coffee we sell is from Earth Friendly and comes from a cooperative in Guatemala. Earth Friendly's owner and the Rotary Club in Homer, Alaska, have been working to help the co-op receive more revenue for their hard work. They have made it possible for them to have a drying field to dry their coffee and they are now able to roast their own coffee. Their latest project is for our orders to go directly to them in Guatemala and they will then ship directly to us. The co-op managers say this will give the co-op and its members 25 to 50 percent more income. Thanks to the owner and the Rotary Club, more of the members make a living wage and will stay in Guatemala.

Notes from the Pastoral Council Meeting Sept. 6 – Dick Mullen was elected chair, Tim Fuller was elected vice-chair, and Veronica Mauk is secretary/trustee. The parish constitution needs to be revised to change the number of members we have serving on the pastoral council. The diocese will be helping us with this. Fr. Ed needs to have office space for privacy and it was agreed to use the confessional for now. Office furniture will be purchased. The dish sanitizer in the kitchen is broken and needs to be replaced. The finance committee has authorized up to \$7,000 for this. A claim will be sent to the insurance company, but the parish has a \$2,500 deductible. The annual meeting will be held Sept. 9 after mass. A scholarship application has been created for students attending All Saints School. Six students have received \$928 for the out-of-parish portion of their tuition this year. We need more servers, readers, etc. The consensus of the council is that we need to be positive and inclusive as we move forward. Fr. Ed mentioned we need to focus more on spiritual rather than material matters. It was suggested having a bulletin board for all the committees' minutes to be posted so the parishioners know what is happening in the parish. We will also be publishing a condensed version of the pastoral council minutes in the bulletin after every meeting. The store room will be unlocked again for now, as it was causing too many problems.
